

Phil Northrup showed his miniature tug attached to a barge both of which have drive mechanisms. There are red lights which illuminate in reverse and white ones for forward motion. He has used fuel tubing for the universal joints.



Tom Stevens reported on how to remove rust from an item using a 5 gallon bucket lined with stainless steel and filled with a soda solution. Current is applied by a battery charger or power supply. Details can be obtained by contacting Tom or Marvin Waldin.



Paul Williams has been volunteering as a docent at the Future of Flight Museum and has been able to use their 3D printer to create plastic items. Apparently they are willing to tutor one willing to help them with their displays.


