I want to wish each of you and your families a wonderful Christmas Season and a very Happy New Year.





These included: Tug regatta, Seafeast in Bellingham, and Keith's report on the Taffy 3 gathering in late October. There was the discussion and mention of the passing of **Tom Stevens** as we remembered him and all that he had done for the hobby. We also got updates on what everyone else had been working on since last summer. **Flodquist** talked about some things on Bens tugboat and gave a report of the NW R/C Dinner meeting, **Ralph** updated us on his current Viking cars restoration, and **Lee** on his new workshop he has been building along with his Grand Banks pleasure boat model.



Show and tell was mostly about the Keith's involvement with the **Taffy 3 Ship Modelers Group** and the events at the **75th anniversary/reunion** of the survivors of this WW2 Task force.





This group is comprised of modelers from across the USA that made r/c models of all 13 ships of this task force with the intent to have them on display at the reunion and then sail them in formation on the next day at a local lake near San Diego, CA with survivors in attendance.





First off was getting there and driving that distance with a model ready to go (but only about 60% finished). The display part was held in a conference room at the Bayside Holiday Inn in San Diego located on the waterfront. There they would be on display the following day after the luncheon and



ceremonies over Point Loma Memorial Park. This was an amazing event at this point to witness a military salute (complete with F-18 jet fly over in the missing man configuration) and recount of the events of that historic day. When the survivors and family came to the model display....well the emotions and stories carried on for over 3 hours! It was truly an inspirational event to be in that room with

all in attendance. The float and formation maneuvers the next day was just as much fun since it was also the first time my model had been in the water floating and operating. Interesting running models in formation with others that have never ran together let alone met until this event! So the model was at the meeting to see what it looks like (although back in shipyard for more work and repairs) along with some of the information and collectors coin that were given to each modeler in recognition of our events.
