But the best thing about this event is that it is more like a family gathering with model tugs thrown in. That is the way I like to look at all this. Having fun is paramount for a seasoned veteran or a novice. We have fun, compete, and learn some new things when doing this (or any event). And, it is another great way to promote our hobby.
