


Eight skippers braved the clearing skies, no breeze and high 40's temperature to have a go at running boats.


Steve Sunich (our host) was showing off his finished Solace motor yacht, which is a very accurate copy of his full size Solace.

Allan with his towboat and Lou with his tugboat tried to get a good angle to push it to shore, but instead she went down to Davey Jones Locker.



The previous month Sweethaven ran fine, but was a little heavy by the bow, so I moved the batteries to toward the stern. I have since changed batteries from AA nickel metal hydride batteries to AAA NIMH batteries which cut the amperage from 2.4 amps per cell to 1 amp, but cut the weight by 2/3s. That should keep Popeye heading to foreign shores again, to battle Bluto.

New 18 Foot Christ Craft Boat


About four years ago at one of our Hobby shop meetings someone brought in some plans for boats. I grabbed one and put it away. So this past fall I opened it up to see what it was. It looked like a simple boat to build. I went out and punched some 1/16th and 1/8 plywood, a Springer hardware kit, and a Dumas deck hardware kit. I traced the ribs on tracing paper and put the frame together and sheeted it.





I sheeted the deck and planked it with Mahoney planks left over from another boat. The seats and motor cover are held on with Velcro. The two hatches are held on with magnets. The surf board is from Maui. The motor and speed control is something I have had for some time. The motor is 1000 KV (1000 RPM per volt). The battery is a LIpo 2C unit





I went out today at Lake Tye. It was sunny day for its first run and it ran fine. The boat had plenty of speed. The motor and speedcontrol stayed cool.



Over all it was a fun project and it runs good.
