#### August 2013 Meeting Minutes by Ron Bray

The events of the evening began at 1905 hours under direction of our commodore, **Bob Jacobsen**. There were no guests or new members to introduce. There was no old business but under new business upcoming events were announced and discussed. At the fun float this Saturday, **Dain Webster** will set up a course similar to the one slated for next month's meeting. The meeting will be a night time fun float at the Bellevue Pond at 7 PM instead of our regular meeting location at Galaxy Hobby. He passed out descriptions of the upcoming event with all the details of the buoy flashing signals, the course setup and many more details which will undoubtedly be the subject of future communication.

Without a break, the next order of business was **Show and Tell**. **Allan Wing** showed video clips he took with his underwater camera at hobby expo last February, detailing the action of the Vought-Schneider drives and the action of the propellers on the South Hampton tug, noting the lack of cavitation. Mel Suelzle gave a power point presentation of the Tidewater event in Spokane last weekend. All but two of the prizes were brought back to the West side, with Robert Osmond winning the overall event. Bob Wickham demonstrated how he used the rubber material supplied by Amie Eng for bumpers and fenders for his new push boat. He also demonstrated Bill McGee's method of setting the middle rail at the same height for each stanchion by using blocks of wood to hold the rail in place while soldering. **Dr. Ron Bray** showed his progress with the Lake Union Dream Boat build. While demonstrating the RC functions, he was unable to get the reverse to function. Mel showed his new two cylinder steam engine he purchased from Graham Industries. He spent a lot of time polishing the components and is awaiting the arrival of high temperature paint. Next comes a boiler and a boat to put them in. Cliff Elowsen presented his Garth Foss and hopes to test it this Saturday at the fun float. This build has progressed slowly over the past two to three years with the end now in sight. Robert Osmond brought in his latest acquisitions from Deans Marine. The large container ship kit looks great with stern and bow thrusters and many containers as well as molds to fabricate additional containers. In addition, he bought a large bulk container hull, a smaller hull of the larger container ship, a chemical container hull, an Edwardian launch hull and a Media yacht kit. It looks like he is going to be busy for some time. Dave White brought in his semi scratch locomotive which won first place in a national competition. He plans to RC it and power it with batteries. Bob Jacobsen displayed his crane barge, which has a fully operational crawler crane installed so that it can be easily removed. He was unable to demonstrate its functions as the transmitter battery was dead.

After the drawing for door prizes the meeting was over at 2017 hours and all 23 of us headed back to our own ports.

#### August Fun Float by Robert Osmond

The August fun float, which was on Sea Fair weekend, was overcast all day with a couple of brief blue sky breaks. We had an impressive attendance of 19 members, including Mike Moore with his magnificent large Shelly Foss, which we had not seen in many years. Scott Bauman was testing his Lipo powered PT 109 by Pro-Boat. It was faster and seemed to run forever on the new lighter batteries. Dain Webster set up his night-time buoy course for us to practice for the September 5th Club meeting, which will be held at the Bellevue Pond at 7:00 PM. After many of the boats had gone through the course with a wide channel he narrowed it to make a "no passing lane" version, which made pulling and pushing barges in opposite directions more challenging. I am sure that when we have the actual night float with the buoys lighted, barges and lighted tugs, it will be guite exciting. We might have to have some Coast Guard patrols of the area, just to ensure that the proper procedures are followed. Bob Jacobsen was pulling his new clamshell crane barge around dropping rubber ducks and sharks on any tug slow enough to stay in his area, then picking them up off the decks and putting them back on his barge. There were some other distractions for the skippers each time a B-25 Mitchell bomber and its P-51 Mustang escort flew over with a Japanese Zero in hot pursuit, they must have flown over 10 times. It was a great day and a good time was had by all.

#### 2013 Tidewater Cup - Mel Suelzle



July 27<sup>th</sup> was the date of the 2013 Tidewater Cup in Spokane. Six members of our club and three spouses attended this event. **Robert Osmond**, **Tim Ripperger**, and regulars **Al Kinsman**, **Bob Wickham**, **Bill McGee** and I rounded our West Coast team for the event. **Aimee Eng** of the Portland club also attended, for the first time. Spokane skippers were fewer this year as medical issues took its toll on participation.

The event is held in a park-like location on the property of the local power company, Avista. This manmade pond has many large rocks and a fountain that contributes to a most interesting and challenging event.

The events consisted of 2 separate competitions. One event is for Springer class boats that require a skipper to take a barge through a very complex course, weaving in and around 18 large and unforgiving boulders. The complexity demands you to have a navigator, allowing the skipper to navigate around and thorough rock lined passages, some with only an inch or so to spare. This most challenging course is difficult to run without hitting at least one rock. It is timed as well to break any ties. This year's Springer event winners were:

In the Tidewater event, the Westside skippers also did well. In the Small Class;
