Looking towards 2007, I have set some goals to simplify some of our processes. I firmly believe that the successes and longevity of the club is due to our lack of structure, rules and formality. Our primary goal is to have fun and enjoy the camaraderie of fellow members. Rules and complexity only get in the way and diminish the ability to meet this primary goal.

I plan to scrutinize every process and look for ways to do it simpler and with less pain and strain. I welcome you suggestions on how we might work toward this goal.

One way we can simplify our dues renewal process was presented and approved at our January meeting. Our policy of having dues renew annually based on the date a member joined, creates complexity and confusion by those that monitor the membership and for members who forget when they joined. Many clubs have everyone's dues payable in January. This simplifies the accounting process and eliminates tracking due dates and much of the follow-up for late payers. In order to be fair with new members we need a way to pro rate dues when members join during the year. If we pro rate by each quarter, then new members need only pay ½ the dues (\$5) for each whole quarter left in the year. Members joining in January thru March pay \$20, If they join in April thru June, its \$15 and so on.

To transition to this annual payment for existing members we will use the same pro rated schedule for renewing dues during 2007. By January 2008 all member dues will be **payable in January**. To assist in this transition, we will list the names of members that are due in the first newsletter of each quarter. Those with due dates of January, February & March are listed in this newsletter.



Vantec Speed Controls

In years past, the club has place quantity orders with Vantec for electronic speed controls. Vantec offers significant discounts for orders of 20 or more. Since there is much interest, we are attempting to put together a quantity order for the Vantec RET 411P. This is a 5-26V, 12 Amp (continuous) ESC that normally lists for \$74.95. If we can place an order for at least 20 units we can get them for \$50 including shipping. To order these as soon as possible yet give everyone a chance to order, we have set a cutoff date of February 15th when we will place the order with Vantec. Your payment must be received by this date. Hopefully, we can have them for distribution at the March meeting. January 7th Fun Float By Allan Wing


