February Minutes by Dr. Ron

With a full house the meeting started promptly at 1900 hours under direction of our chief – Lee Stewart. Two guests were introduced: **Terry Iom** from Everett and **Brian Morris** from Lynnwood. Both had seen our web site and decided to see what our club was all about. Brian joined later in the evening. Welcome aboard!

Since there was no old business, new business was initiated. First off, **Kevin Klocke** brought everyone up to speed on the upcoming Model Expo at Monroe February 10-12. Set up will be on Thursday at noon. However, the show starts on Friday at 3PM and ends Sunday at 3PM. Those entering models to be judged must wait until Sunday to retrieve them. Kevin also discussed the Pacific Marine Expo and stated that next year Markee Winches might sponsor the pond. Our model boat exhibit again seemed to be most favorably accepted, according to a You-Tube video.

Lee mentioned that a catalog of Earl Anderson's donated items was e-mailed to members and that the items will be auctioned at the March meeting. **Bob Jacobsen** passed out invitations to his "open shop" on Saturday, February 25th from 11AM to 3PM with hot dogs, chips and drinks to be served from 12:30 to 2:00PM. If weather permits, we can run our boats in the lake. It appears that Bob's new shop is gargantuan and fabulous. According to **Scott Bauman** there will be a great model exhibition the 18 –19th at the Boeing Field Museum of Flight, which will include airplanes, cars, boats, robots, etc., including Bob's R2D2 robot.

Dain Webster brought up the prospect of a night float and it appeared there was a lot of interest in this idea. So, he will have strobe flashing buoys made up to highlight the course at this event which most likely will be held at the Bellevue pond.

There was discussion regarding attendance at the fun floats and timing of the events. It appears that some early participants have run out of juice and departed before the scheduled time of 12 noon even though the pond is reserved from 10 to 4 on the first Sunday following the meeting each month. It was stressed that better communication among those wishing to participate be considered, to set up arrival times.

There were no announcements and upcoming events are presented in another part of the newsletter.

After a break, show and tell commenced with **Dr. Ron** leading off by describing his Robbe **Happy Hunter** build which he started in January. Securing the shafts, rudder posts and bow thruster using forms to contain the epoxy was discussed. The quality of the materials and accuracy of the parts was mentioned, which enables trouble free building with no need to do a lot of modification to make the parts fit into position. He described a method of activating the bow thruster with maximum rudder throw. **Doug Wilson** showed his progress on his twin screw 3:1 400 speed geared motor pusher tug. He enlarged the plans he obtained from Tug Boat Joe 2 1/2 times, **Phil Northrup** brought in his first epoxy **West Track 2** Z-drive tugboat hull with molded cabin, pilot house and stack. He offered it for sale and Mel snapped it up. Phil made the original mold and sold it to Harbor Models. **Mike Jones** brought in his elegant Preston build with the recently constructed brass paddlewheel. He plans to have identical lighting and mechanical functions as the

large 1:1 boat. The steam engine and boiler are in the process of being manufactured. Concern was raised over the possibility of fire onboard and how it could be extinguished by some form of internal fire extinguishing system– CO2 or Halon – since removing the top would be too time consuming. **Tom Stevens** showed his intricately detailed work shop which goes on his crane barge. The small wrenches and other tools, etc., were purchased from doll house shows. He has many automotive LEDs to provide light to illuminate all the great features. **Frank Smith** brought in a partially built Graupner **Shark** RC U-Boat, offering it to anyone who could provide a good home for it. Since there so much interest, it was decided to add it to the auction items for next month's auction meeting.

The meeting concluded at 2035 hours and everyone climbed into their boats for a journey to home port.




Tips & Tricks

PAINING AND DETAILING SECRETS




SAVE THOSE BRUSHES

To keep dope-brush bristles straight, drill a hole in the brush handle, put a dowel through the hole, and suspend the brush in thinner.




PARK THAT BRUSH

A tapered slot in a metal or Formica disk grips dope brushes so that they won't touch the jar's bottom when they're soaking in thinner.




DISPOSABLE APPLICATORS

Why buy disposable brushes? Sheets of craft foam, folded and taped as shown, make inexpensive applicators for urethane or epoxy protective coatings. (Or, for the environment's sake, clean and re-use your brushes!)




WINCH GEARS

Collect old servo, watch and clock gears and incorporate them into your deck winches, cranes and gantries. They don't have to operate to look striking!



THINNER TRANSFER

Transfer thinner the clean way. Place a tube in the thinner, and "seal" its top with your finger. Transfer the loaded tube to the dope jar, remove your finger, and the thinner will run out.



AVOID A MESS

Punch holes around the lip of a dope can so that overspill can drain back into the can, and splatters can be reduced.
