Mel Suelzle gave a report on our insurance coverage from the **Scale Ship Modeling Association**. Our club can be insured, for all sanctioned events, if there are at least five NWSM club members who are current members of SSMA. Members of SSMA, attending any non-sanctioned event, are covered as an individual. Some venues will require additional funding up to \$125. Certification for our events at the Bellevue pond is forthcoming. **UPDATE**—The city of Bellevue has our insurance and has approved all our scheduled events at the Bellevue Pond for 2014.

He brought a roll of plastic wrap to cover models and to attract dust particles away from the model.



Next, Mel showed the ready built runabout he bought at the boat show, which he plans to RC with an out-runner motor and LiPo batteries.

Roger Lyons showed his hot rod Southampton Tug, powered by brushless motors, a speed control from Dimension Engineering and LiPo batteries. He also showed the

bomb box required to safely charge these batteries.



Robert Wickham provided data regarding power consumption for some water pumps purchased from E-Bay, with the conclusion that they are not adequate for fire nozzles, but are

great for motor cooling coils at 3 volts.

Phil Northrup demonstrated the workings of his wa Class Battleship, which have been in progress since his wife gave it to him for Christmas. (lucky guy).

In The News

Chinese Navy Provokes US Navy Cruiser

On December 5, 2014, Chinese warships accompanying Beijing's new aircraft carrier *Liaoning*, in the South China Sea (neutral ocean), came within 100 yards of the cruiser *USS Cowpens*, which was monitoring the new aircraft carrier. The two crews established communications and the Chinese ships ceased their harassment.

In past dealings with a World Power Navy, the Soviet Navy's officers knew that to act provocatively to a US ship could end their career. The Chinese Navy avoided confrontations with the US and their neighbors during their "peaceful rise" policy of Deng Xiaoping from 1978 till 2008. In 2008, the Chinese leaders believed that with the economic problems and down turn in the US and other countries, these countries were now weak and the Chinese should push their agenda. They systematically angered seven of their neighbors. They made a claim to the Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh, demanded the Senkakus Islands from Japan, and declared ownership of large portions of the South China Sea, hundreds of miles from any Chinese coast, but within the exclusive economic zones of the Philippines, Brunei, Malaysia, Indonesia and Vietnam. These demands are even now shown on Chinese passports, where the map on the cover includes the waters of South Korea. These seven countries have joined together, at least politically. This has even taken the form of India supplying Vietnam with modern submarines. It will be interesting to see how this plays out.
