Boats, to show us your project. You do not need to wait until they are finished. I believe that seeing boats being worked on encourages others to work on their boats.


Tools and materials that you think that the club members might not know about or might not know all of the applications they can be used for.

January Minutes by Dr. Ron Bray

Thirty wind-blown and soaked swabbies were present for tonight's meeting with **Robert Osmond** presiding, as our new president. There were no guests or new members to acknowledge. Under new business, Robert announced that **Hobby Expo** would be held February 7, 8, 9th, at the **Monroe Evergreen Fairgrounds**. We will have a booth and the pond in the same building as last year, along with the vendors, tank group and aircraft hobbyists. The swap meet will be in the adjacent, older building. A sign-up sheet was passed around to make sure that our display area will be represented at all times. **Kevin Klocke** plans to start assembling the pond at noon, on Thursday, and will need volunteers to help.



Allan Kinsman discussed the spring regatta, mentioning that **Tom Stevens** will be the scale judge, **Scott Bauman** and **Bob Wickham** will be the navigation judges. Bob will also arrange for the food. Further discussions will be held at various gatherings, for input on the course layout.

Insurance coverage, for the club, provided by **Scale Ship Modeler's Association**, was discussed. We are required to have coverage for the various venues we use during the year. The **SSMA** requires a minimum of five of our members join this organization, in order to obtain a certificate of coverage. By being a member of this organization, the individual member is covered by a policy where ever he may sail his boats, as an individual. **Mel Suelzle** will look into details and present his findings at a future meeting. The **SSMA** journal was passed around, so members could evaluate the merits of membership. Those wishing to join **SSMA** can contact Robert Osmond or Dr. Ron Bray, for the application form. Fun float scheduling was discussed and the members, present, voted to change the venue from Sunday to Saturday. **Dave Green** will contact the Bellevue Parks Department to see if this is possible and will provide them with the certificate of insurance coverage, once it is received from **SSMA**. **Bob Jacobsen** will contact the Lynnwood pool personnel, to see if it is feasible to have some of our winter floats at this facility.

Robert brought in an article from the **New York Times**, reporting on Chinese naval provocation, in international waters. During the break, Bob Wickham set up a side by side demonstration of **ProBoat** speed controllers, the old blue one and the newer narrower one, showing the much improved lower end with the latter. During show and tell Tom Stevens gave a demonstration of several different paint spray guns and the advantages of each. Robert Wickham gave a great discussion on the basics of soldering. Several soldering devices were displayed as well as soldering paste flux (**Everflux**), types of solder, soldering pads, and solder removers.

Ron Burchett brought in his 16 year old tug, *Namahoe,* which suffered minor damage from a rear end collision on I-5, on the way to the meeting. He will be delivering the tug to a client's private jet tomorrow and hopefully will get it repaired before then.

Bob Jacobsen has another project, a *Vosper* kit, from China. Apparently the quality of the kit is not up to par. He is presently remodeling the not so hot torpedoes.





Dr. Ron Bray reported on his build of the Robbe schooner kit, *Valdivia*, elaborating on some of the modifications he has performed.

Dee Obee brought in his Dumas kit **Shelly Foss**, demonstrating the progress he has made.





Cliff Elowson discussed the many details of his finished *Lindsey Garth*, "**Peggy B**", **Foss** tug build, which has taken three years to complete.

After show and tell, chairs were stacked and projects carried out into a rainy, cool night. Everyone went away with knowledge of new tools, tricks, building techniques and available products to facilitate our builds.
