#### NW R/C Ship Modelers Meeting Minutes By, Dr. Ron

June 3<sup>rd</sup> Meeting

At 1900, our commander, Allan Wing commenced the meeting. The room was filled with members and two guests. John Wilcox learned of our organization from the internet and decided to check us out. Gary Bray was a guest of Dr. Ron and is staying with him while his wife is recovering in the hospital after recent surgery.

The regatta is this Saturday and Allan discussed many of the final details. Best of show will be awarded to the best looking and best performing vessel this year with best of scale points added to the navigation scores. A first in each scale division will be awarded 9 points, a second 6 points and a 3<sup>rd</sup> 3 points. The raffle will be a little different this year with the smaller prizes drawn after a cut off period and posted on a bulletin board. The winner can take the ticket to the prize table and pick up his winnings. The larger prizes will be raffled as before while judges are calculating event results. Tom Stevens brought two music stands so that the navigation courses can be placed in plain view on either side of the judging table. Allan asked for volunteers to help set up and dismantle the course and to help clean up the area and carry items to the vehicles.

**Dennis Chinn** offered his pool for a polo event the following Thursday or Saturday and an e-mail will be sent out to get a feel for how many to expect and on which date.

The **July fun float** will be on the **11**<sup>th</sup> due to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration. Other events were announced and discussed and dates can be found in the event guide of the Bilge Pump. The subject of insurance was again discussed and it was decided not to renew it since we wong be having any sanctioned large events in Seattle. **Dave White** announced the

**Puget Sound Garden RR Society Event (www.2010ngrc.com)** to be held at the Snoqualmie museum from the 2<sup>nd</sup> through the 7<sup>th</sup> of August. Next, **Tom Stevens** demonstrated a lot of new additions to the fishing trawler his dad built which replicated exactly the real boat he built with spiled planks for both. Some of the additions were: a working compass, fishing gear and rigging, keel coolers, zinc plates, etc. He also brought in some tire fenders and his unique way of attaching them by using a brass ring inside the tire to which he attached leaded fly tying line which can be affixed without tying any knots.





**Dennis Chinn** brought in his scratch built Canadian coastguard rescue boat and demonstrated his sound system and described how to make the decks look realistic with textured paint. The plans were obtained from Loyalhanna.



Allan Wing showed his new project . a solar powered green boat. He obtains 7-



11 volts at 200 milliamps when the sun shines. Wrinkling of paint occurred and a lively discussion followed on how to avert this difficulty.

We stacked the chairs at 2025 and drifted homeward.
