Planning and preparation is almost complete for our 26th annual regatta. We expect to have another great event for our members and visitors from other clubs in the Northwest. Before the Regatta, we have one meeting and a fun float to do our final tune up before the big event. Our course will be similar to last year's, so skippers will have to deal with the whirlpool as they exit Deception Pass. To make things even more interesting, Randy Flodquist and Burt Maxwell promise to have their ferry boats ready to traverse the course and provide some high priority traffic on the course. Skippers will have to make sure they give way to the ferry at all times unless you are a work boat that is actually working. So tugs with barges have the right away. All others should give way to the ferry boats. Judges will be watching to make sure that pleasure boaters and off duty work boats do not interfere with the ferry traffic. Judges will be more critical than in previous years and the course will have a few new "wrinkles".

Here are some key items about the regatta:

Setup will start around 7AM and extra help is always appreciated

Registration will be open from 9:00 to 10:00 AM

Skipper's meeting about 10:15 AM, scale judging begins at 10:30 AM

Navigation course opens as soon as the first category of scale judging is completed

Registration is \$6 (\$3 under 16) for the first 2 boats, \$1 for each additional boat

Registered skippers and their families are invited to a complementary lunch

We have some GREAT prizes to be raffled. Raffle tickets are \$1 each or 6 for \$5. Drawings will be around 3:00 PM. Prizes and donors are listed elsewhere in this newsletter.

When the results are in, over 20 awards will be presented to the best models and skippers

We don't anticipate a problem with parking again this year. The spaces around the pond are still posted as a 3 hr limit. However they are not monitored on wee


