Burt first became interested in tug boat models, working at Western Gear, while watching a tug boat traveling back and forth, pushing logs, etc.. However, he started modeling railroad stuff as a kid and then scratch built a steam tugboat which he sold to buy locomotives. The model tug he first built was described by Cliff as the ugliest tug he had ever seen. He gave it to his grandson but isn't sure of its whereabouts. With that tug he joined the NWRC Shipmodelers club in 1988.He built a Brooklyn tug kit, then considerably revamped it, and runs it today as the Active. After the revamp Cliff



complimented him for his uncanny eye for scale, not relying on plans for these projects. He has built a really cool operational crane and barge and recently finished a ferry boat and functional dock.

Construction projects are accomplished in the 2nd bedroom of his apartment in Arlington and he often has difficulty navigating the hallways, which are loaded with his many projects. One of his other hobbies is painting and displays a lovely picture of the Lady Washington which hangs in his living room

Burt was born in Bremerton in 1929, attended Bremerton schools and joined the Navy serving aboard the USS Princeton (an aircraft carrier). Since he played the trumpet in the high school band it was a no brainer that he became the ship's bugler (a lot better duty than in the mess hall).

He had a knack of being able to play by ear – anything he heard. After the Navy he worked for the navel ammunition depot in Bremerton, had numerous jobs off and on moved to Seattle to work for Boeing (3 years), spent a month or so traveling in Europe with 20 friends, worked for Disston Saws and then got laid off which led to his job at Western Gear where he worked 25 years in the assembly and testing departments before the company dissolved. He was married in 1961 and widowed in 1997, prompting his move to Arlington. After 20 years, he continues to work for Avis Rent a Car ferrying cars from one location to another.

In the future he would like to see the club acquire a pond like the one at Bellevue for testing, fun floats and events. Burt has been a very loyal member and rarely misses a meeting on event.
