

Regatta Planning


Allan is working the details for the June Regatta. Registration forms and score sheets are being coordinated with the pond masters, Al Kinsman and Earl Anderson.

Tom Stevens shared his practice of using adhesive backed sandpaper on a flat surface to keep items from sliding around. A piece of plate glass is an excellent flat surface and can be used as a sharpening plane for woodworking tools.

Robert Wickham showed off his Amsterdam tug renamed "Jezebel" or something similar. He has a pair of huge props driven by a 5:1 gear reduction motor drive that puts this tug on a serious plane. He is getting carried away with lighting and so far is up to 32 lights. With this many lights he can join the Christmas parade on Lake Union next December.

Marvin Walden brought in his rejuvenated Yamamoto model that has been a mantelpiece for several years. It has a solid carved hull and has been refitted a number of times and often used to harass ducks.
