November 2nd Meeting Minutes

On a chilly moonlit night, 22 members were brought to attention by our commodore, **Mel Suelzle**. Show and tell began with **Tom Stevens** demonstrating how water leaks can be spotted using a special water indicating paste. He showed his glue thief, a small tool with a loop at the end to

as a pattern marker. **Robert Wickham** brought in his ProBoat hull which he intends to lengthen and install jet drives as well as detailing the model, a feat which he has incredible talent. **John LeGate** showed progress he is making on his tug build. **Robert Osmond** had several items to show us. First was his strand beast which is a wind powered crawler. Apparently, several kits are made by a fellow in Denmark and can be purchased on E-Bay and can be seen on U-Tube. He offered some polyethylene sheeting to anyone who would like to use it to protect surfaces from glue droppings or to

cover models from dust during storage. He uses a slotted brass tube slightly larger than a drive or rudder shaft needed to be removed. He also uses post it notes to mix epoxy glues and then can dispose of them. He showed several scaling rulers which can be purchased to enable direct scale measurements. Several small tug kits were brought out of his archives for display. Progress on his PBR riverboat was addressed. Doc acquired many power and sail boat plans which can be copied by members in order to facilitate building a scratch build model.



Before the break, Mel demonstrated the attributes of the new projector recently acquired for the club. He showed pictures of the model display now being held at the Edmonds museum. He is hoping to have our January meeting there.
