weekend with fifteen of us attending. We got all the jobs for the Regatta filled. We had a good Show and Tell. Some exhibiting new gadgets and proper lighting on night floats. We will be doing just the raffle with cups to place tickets in for the nicer items. How many is to be determined.

## NWRCSM's Navigation & Tug Boat Regatta Information: August 2nd, 2025

# There will be two separate courses at the August 2 event, they will be a

- 1. Navigation course for any boat and a
- 2. <u>Tug course for a tug with a barge, being pulled,</u>

#### pushed or on the hip.

#### The boat size classes for both events will be:

<u>Measured between verticals that clear all parts of the ship.</u> 22" and under is **Small** Over 22" and under 40" will be **Medium** Over 40" will be Large

#### For the tug events:

- **Tug Course**: Each tug will have to use a barge that is at *least twice the length of the tug.* The barge will have to have a draft of at least ½ of the depth of the barge hull.
- **Salvage Event:** With Orville hooks to catch and pull in one of three different size ships (which were recently completely rebuilt by Robert Wickham) to pull through a gate and pin to the wall of the pond next to the score board. This wall has colored bands from the center in each direction so we can judge how close you finish to the center mark.
- **Team Towing:** Two captains will each take one end of the Liberty ship and pull it away from the shore, then out though a gate, then back through the gate, to the shore, and pin it against the shore.
- **Tugboat Race:** Determined by interest as to classes. This will be from a starting gate and around a buoy and back to the starting gate to determine a winner.

#### Raffle prizes: Per the voting at the July 3<sup>rd</sup> club meeting.

- There will be raffle tickets sold at the price of \$1.00 each or 6 tickets for \$5.00, as in past years.
- We will draw tickets all day and post the numbers on the board for you to match up and claim. These will be smaller items.
- After the boat running events have ended, we will have drawings for the large prizes. The more tickets you purchase the more possibilities you have of winning.

Note: The raffle ticket sales are how the club earns enough money to pay for the regattas, fun floats, and other costs. Without this money we would have to cut back on expenditures. So, buy those tickets! <u>View them as a</u> <u>donation to the club</u> which could result in you getting something that you want.

The Meeting was called to order at 19:01 with fifteen members in attendance.

The treasurer reported the amount of the club's account. Two checks are going out to pay for storage of the club's property and batteries. A check is incoming from a sponsor for the club regatta.

Also, a reminder that we need a new newsletter editor. Paul Williams is looking to step down at the end of the year.

After a short discussion, the club decided to move the November Fun Float from Saturday the eighth to Sunday the ninth due to a college football game. Traditionally, the Seattle Yacht Club gets busy when the University of Washington Huskies have a home game.

The idea to do a Christmas night in December was brought up. There was a low interest.

Club decals are running very low. These are stickers with our logo which go on the rear window of member's cars. Arrangements are being made to order new supply from Callie Graphics.

A discussion of regatta preparation followed. As a reminder, the "August" meeting will occur on Thursday July 31, so that we can have our meeting before the regatta. **Bryan Morse, Robert Wickham,** and **Allan Wing** have accepted roles as judges and we are looking for one alternate. The Harbor Master will be **Dave White**. **Dave White's** brother will be selling raffle tickets for \$1 each or six for \$5. There will be no auction this year. We are looking for a registrar person to collect \$10 (\$5 a piece for additional boats) for registration fees. **Bob Spiger** and **Dave Kentala** will bring three trays of sandwiches for lunch. A team is ready to load the truck with our course obstacles and we are looking for

Sunday volunteers to help unload the truck after the event. **Robert Osmond** will print regatta flyers.

Members are encouraged to use the Meetup app to help generate interest in the club and attract new members.

**Jon McCool** said that the US Coast Guard Barque *Eagle* will be in Seattle on July 9th and 10th. He is planning to go on the 10th.

Show and Tell-

**Robert Osmond** showed the photos for our "dash" plaques to be used in this year's regatta. The navigation regatta recognition will honor **Dave Green** with a great photo of his beautiful USCG Cutter *Casco* scale model. The tugboat plaque will show a photo that captures 5 club tugboats (and a sailboat) in one tasteful composition.



A short lesson on lights followed. A bow light should shine in a 225 degree arc. The stern light should be a 135 degree arc. A red light should be visible on the port (left) side and a green light on the starboard (right). One way to remember is that "port" and "red" are shorter words and "green" and "starboard" are longer words. There should be a light at the top of a ship's mast and other lights on the mast can be used for communication.



He also talked about his orange submarine. It is a Robbie kit that he has had for a while. It was called *Shark* and was quite fast and fun. Robert added a skid to the bottom to protect it when running in the relatively shallow pond in Bellevue.



**Paul Williams** spoke about 3D printing. He was trying to make a new steering wheel knob for a radio transmitter. Getting just the right size is a challenge.



**Chris Merrill** talked about a volt and Amp meter that he received for Father's Day. The digital meter was inexpensive to buy on Amazon. He tested it against his older meters and it proved to show accurate readings.



**Pat Plueard** spoke about a new "LiFeP04" six-volt battery that looks just like a SLA (Sealed Lead-Acid) battery, but it's much lighter. Interestingly, it can be charged using USB-C connections. He found them at a price of two for \$12 on the Internet.



Also, Pat showed us an aluminum camera stick. He was looking for a mount for a 4K security camera and found this very affordable option on Amazon searching for a "clamp camera mount". It might also be useful for holding parts or tools when model building.

The meeting was adjourned at 20:04. Afterwards, members had time to inspect items.
